Upon departing Pictura Gallery, you'll head towards Morton Street, where you will find an array of locally owned shopping choices including a historic three-story antique mall, a vintage store with many eclectic treasures, and a loft-like urban marketplace. Descriptions of each store are listed below.

#### A.Z. VINTAGE

Owner Alison Zook opened her shop in 2012 and it is positively brimming with an eclectic mix of vintage furniture, housewares, and men's and women's clothing and accessories. A.Z Vintage specializes in the mid-century modern period but carries a wide range of delicious finds from the '40s through the '80s. You'll find unique vintage threads here that you can't find anywhere else, so be prepared to come home with some souvenirs!

## **BLOOMINGTON ANTIQUE MALL**

The 24,000 square-foot building is located in the Near West Side Historic District that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Originally the John R. Figg Wholesale Grocery Company, it was built circa 1900 adjacent to the Monon Railway (now the B-Line Trail) as a distribution center for foodstuffs. It first became an antique mall in 1987.

#### RELISH

Bloomingtonians Brad & Sharon Fugate opened Relish's doors in 2004 to a curated collection of contemporary home furnishings, lighting and art objects as well as the city's most creative selection of women's apparel and accessories. This locally owned downtown destination invites you to experience an ever-changing showcase of select product in a loft-like environment.
