Stroll the streets of downtown Fort Worth with a noted historian and learn more about one of the most innovative and exciting urban areas in the nation on these free, open-to-the-public tours.

Here to soak in the city's artistic treasures? Head straight to the Cultural District. Want to delve into the city's Western roots? WEST 7TH The Stockyards National Historic District is the place

to be. For a more urban experience, head to Fort Worth's premier shopping and entertainment district, Sundance Square, located in the heart of **Downtown**. Get into the racing action at Texas Motor Speedway (TMS), or discover riverfront adventures on Panther Island. If you have kids in tow, the Fort Worth Zoo is an absolute must. Foodies should definitely get a taste of the many prominent restaurants in the Near Southside and West 7th, and shoppers will want to beeline to Camp Bowie Boulevard.

Fort Worth Herd Cow Camp



The heart and soul of Fort Worth, Sundance Square entails a 35-block area filled with vintage buildings, gleaming skyscrapers, shopping, restaurants, grand and boutique hotels and, perhaps most stunningly of all, its outdoor plaza.

YOUR ITINERARY

EAT: Enjoy modern American cuisine and signature cocktails at GRACE, take in some fresh air on the patio while enjoying cowboy cuisine at Reata, or take in the view of the Plaza from Bird Café.

SHOP: Browse specialty boutiques, gift shops and galleries in Sundance Square, where you can valet park for free with validation. Shop stores such as White House | Black Market, Ann Taylor Loft and H&M. Get a custom-made hat at Peter Bros. Hats, which started in 1911.

EXPLORE: Sundance Square Plaza

is a fabulous outdoor space with sparkling fountains, giant umbrellas and the historic Chisholm Trail Mural. Seasonal activities include concerts, movies and yoga classes. Explore more outdoor attractions such as the multi-level Fort Worth Water Gardens and nearby Burnett Park, a two-acre park touting a "great lawn" and one of the most distinctive public art pieces in the city: Man with a Briefcase.

LISTEN: Hear opera and classical music at Bass Performance Hall, or take in a jazz performance at the swanky Scat Jazz Lounge or listen to yearround live performances in Sundance Square Plaza.

Stand in Sundance Square Plaza and choose your backdrop, whether that's the historic Tarrant County Courthouse's beautiful clock tower, the Plaza's dancing fountains, the wave wall fountain or the Chisholm Trail Mural. #SeeFortWorth

WHO'S THERE:

Everyone from young kids, who love to frolic in the fountain, to couples of all ages seeking shopping and entertainment.

MAIN DRAG:

Downtown is known for its walkability, and both Main Street and Houston Street offer lively nightlife, dining and shopping.

SHOP: Pick up delightful body care products and aromatic essential oils at **Sunflower Shoppe**. Western-chic home décor at A Lost Treasure, unique antiques at **Carter Bowden Antiques** and high-end home goods at Wright at Home. The Village at Camp Bowie is another spot for numerous retail options.



SEE: Peruse new artwork at the cooperative

gallery Art on the Boulevard or at William Campbell Contemporary Art.



EXPLORE: For a dose of nature, Veterans Memorial

Park is a small green space featuring historical markers, an inspiring monument and an anchor from the USS Fort Worth.

MAIN DRAG:

Magnolia Avenue



EAT: For a true taste of Fort Worth's dazzling dining scene, indulge in the locally grown ingredients at Ellerbe Fine Foods, order farmto-table fare made from scratch at **BREWED** or fill up on rustic Italian favorites at the BYOB Nonna Tata. And for dessert? You won't want to miss the out-ofthe-ordinary flavors at Melt Ice Creams.


SHOP: Peruse the popup shops at the 1208 Building, pick up flavor-packed spices at Pendery's World of Chili and Spices or score a deal on Western wares at Justin **Boots Outlet or Dickies Factory** Outlet.



SEE: Take a peek into the grandeur of a bygone era at

Thistle Hill & Ball-Eddleman-McFarland House, or kick back and enjoy the local concerts at the one-acre Magnolia Green.

GO OUT: Make the most of the nightlife scene by sipping a Prohibition-era cocktail at The Usual, ordering a craft beer at The Bearded Lady or catching a live show at Live Oak, Stage West or Arts Fifth Avenue. YOUR ITINERARY



EXPLORE: Grab an inner tube and float in front of **Panther Island Pavilion**,

boasting the only waterfront stage in Texas. This multi-stage music venue hosts a variety of events throughout the year, including Rockin' the River music series (June - August), and The Shack at Panther Island Pavilion is home to an annual Oktoberfest celebration (September). Bike, run or walk along the **Trinity Trail**, which winds alongside the scenic Trinity River. For adventurers looking to make waves, take a dip in the river, or head to Cowtown Wakepark, where you can try something new (or even show off a few tricks) with its cable system that allows for a boat-free wakeboarding experience. Just strap in, grab on, and get ripping.



SEE: For an outdoor movie, head over to **Coyote Urban Drive-In**, showing a double

feature on three screens nightly, which you can view from your car or under the stars. Sports fans will want to visit **LaGrave Field**, home of the Fort Worth Vaqueros (soccer).



DRINK: Located along the scenic banks of the Trinity River, **Panther Island ng** boasts a lineup of creative

Brewing boasts a lineup of creative craft beers, such as the Real Good unfiltered cream ale.


Local Acts



Cutting Edge Rodeo Goat

This restaurant's ice house and patio are fabulous, but its greatness lies in the award-winning Chaca Oaxaca burger. The patty blending beef and chorizo is topped by avocado pico de gallo, queso fresco and a fried egg, with Tabasco mayo spread on the bun.

COCKTAILS:

Classic White Elephant Saloon

Belly up to the antique brass rail that lines the bar at this watering hole straight out of the Wild West. Order the timeless dirty martini made with Tito's Handmade Vodka, and enjoy the nightly live music show.

Cutting Edge Clay Pigeon Food & Drink

Take your thirst for specialty spirits over to this hotspot, where the craft cocktail menu stars Killing Thyme, a mix of Absolut with blood orange drinking vinegar, fresh lime juice, thyme sprigs, orange bitters and a splash of sparkling water.







BARBECUE:

Classic Angelo's Bar-B-Q

The 1950s are alive and well inside the landmark serving hickory-smoked goodness. Get a platter laden with beef brisket, pork ribs and jalapeno sausage, and – if you want a big, icy-cold schooner of Bud – ask for "a large."

Cutting Edge The Woodshed Smokehouse

Global 'cue in the new age means Korean-style, mesquite-smoked bulgogi beef tacos, oak-smoked lamb brisket, hickory-smoked loaded baked potato and garden-fresh veggies grilled over a pecan wood fire.

PIZZA:

Classic Mama's Pizza Founded in 1968, this

local pizzeria chain serves up classic East Coast-style pies made

from scratch and perfectly baked in a hot brick oven. Stop by the Camp Bowie location for a taste of this award-winning pizza.

Cutting Edge Thirteen Pies

West 7th's artisan pizza bistro features a wood-burning oven dispensing cracker-crisp pies starring such modern toppers as proscuitto, lamb sausage, arugula and goat cheese.

Opened in 2004, Fort Worth's first microbrewery now offers nearly a dozen year-round and seasonal beers, plus tours on Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Martin House Brewing Company

The rising star on the local brewery scene, Martin House became an instant sensation with its Daybreak "breakfast" beer: an ale brewed with four grains, milk sugar and honey.

Panther Island Brewing

Newcomer Panther Island specializes in flavorful beer with funky names, like the Cannonball (a Scottish strong ale) and the Allergeez (an American wheat brewed with Texas honey and flowers).

Nickels Distilling

Located in the historic Old Firehouse No. 5, this is the where TreyMark Black-Eyed Vodka is distilled from black-eyed peas — the first of its kind in the world.

Firestone & Robertson Distilling Co.

Both Texas blended whiskey and straight bourbon are served at this distillery, housed inside a pre-Prohibition-era warehouse.

Chimera Brewing Company

Expect a lineup of complex craft beers such as saisons and barrel-aged brews, paired with traditional Italian pizza made from scratch.

The Collective Brewing Project


Ride your bike to the Near Southside and grab a seat in this taproom to try everything from rich porters to sour beers made onsite.

The favorite hand-held food of Texas offers assorted interpretations longer than the Rio Grande and more irresistible than a West Texas sunset. Tortillas — whether made of corn or flour — are the preferred jacket for holding assorted meats, vegetables, herbs and condiments, but lettuce wraps do make a virtuous vehicle for Mexican-inspired deliciousness, too.

Melis Ταqueriα: Open early morning through dinnertime, this tiny shack with picnic tables is a longtime favorite. At breakfast, order one chorizo-egg, one potato-egg and one bacon-egg, in flour or corn tortillas, and you're good through lunchtime. Be sure to try both red and green salsas, and remember to bring cash.

Salsα Limon: Only in Mexico City can you find better street tacos than at this Cultural District taco café.

Wrapped inside a double layering of delicate corn tortillas, the barbacoa version is fall-apart-tender beef cheek, braised with herbs and topped with pickled cabbage, onion and cilantro. Wash this down with a tall, icy-cold glass of freshly made hibiscus tea.

Taco Heads: The shredded beef brisket taco, topped with pico de gallo, crumbled white Mexican cheese and avocado slices (which you douse with a squeeze of lime) is the stuff taco dreams are made of. The city's beloved taco truck serves late-night behind Poag Mahone's and mornings at Avoca Coffee, and moves into its first brick-and-mortar restaurant with a full bar — in February 2016.

Torchy's Tacos: Who can resist the Trailer Park Taco, combining fried chicken with green chiles, lettuce, pico de gallo and shredded cheese inside a flour tortilla? Only someone preferring the Mr. Pink, a corn tortilla taco stuffed with seared ahi tuna, shredded cabbage, crumbled queso fresco and chipotle sauce.

Hot Food Trend: Food Trucks

Enjoy casual eats in the great outdoors with one of these food truck parks.

Fort Worth Food Truck Park

Sample a range of cuisines in Fort Worth's first food truck park, a serene setting just west of downtown.

Clearfork Food Truck Park

This dog-friendly food park on the Trinity River features revolving food trucks and a permanent cantina serving beer and wine.

Food Park @ Thistle Hill

Chow down on gourmet street food at the park-like grounds of historic Georgian Revival-style estate, Thistle Hill.

Lola's Saloon

This old-school venue touting sprawling patios, live music and Texas-brewed beers recently upped the ante with its massive backyard expansion: a 700-capacity outdoor beer garden with a new stage, food truck park and an expanded parking area.

Yucatan Taco Stand: The signature taco here finds tempura-fried white fish tossed with shredded lettuce, tomato bits, red onion, cilantro, a little purple cabbage and roasted garlic aioli inside a steamed white corn tortilla. A basket full of these is recommended with one of the frozen mango margaritas, served at the restaurant's very lively bar.

Velvet Taco: A favorite vegetarian option is the lettuce-wrap taco cradling a bed of Israeli cous cous topped with roasted Portobello mushroom, grilled halumi cheese, pickled chiles and micro greens topped with a sauce duo of parlsey-mint pesto and cucumberdill yogurt. For dessert, there's red velvet cake drizzled with butterscotch cajeta.





cowboy / rodeo

Real cowboys rounding up cattle herds, historic boot shops still making handcrafted wares, the world's largest honky-tonk — it's all here in Fort Worth, where the West begins.

Fort Worth Herd

Get a glimpse of cowboys in action at the only twice-daily cattle drive in the world. At 11:30 a.m. and 4 p.m., cowhands on horseback lead a herd of real longhorns down Exchange Avenue.

Cow Camp

Led by the real-life cattle drovers from The Fort Worth Herd, this hands-on camp (Memorial Day-Labor Day) teaches kids and adults about roping, sorting cattle, saddling a horse and more. They'll also hear an entertaining chuck wagon story or two.

Stockyards Championship Rodeo

Catch real rodeo action every Friday and Saturday night at 8 p.m. in the Cowtown Coliseum. Cheer on athletes during events like bull riding, bareback riding, tie-down roping and barrel racing.

Stockyards Adventure Tour


See all the sights and sounds of the Old West with one convenient pass. Starting at the Stockyards Visitor Center, you'll watch the "Spirit of the West" movie, visit the Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame, have your photo taken on the bull at Billy Bob's Texas, watch the longhorn cattle drive and get Western souvenirs such as a bandana, Stockyards map, special deal vouchers and more.

Texas Cowboy Hall of Fame

Explore the careers of world-champion bull riders and barrel racers, as well as Texas icons like Nolan Ryan and Tommy Lee Jones, at this museum located in a former horse and mule barn.

National Cowgirl Museum

Livestock Exchange Building

Discover Fort Worth's rich history in this adobe-style building built in 1902. Initially serving as the business epicenter for cattle traders, today it's the home of the Stockyards Museum, offering a peek into the past. While you're here, don't miss the light bulb that's been burning for 107 years.

Texas Trail of Fame

See Fort Worth's version of the Hollywood Walk of Fame, dedicated to those who contributed to the Western way of life. You'll find John Wayne, Will Rogers, Zane Grey, Dale Evans - 116 stars in all.

Cowtown Coliseum

Get ready to say yee-haw at this historic arena in the Stockyards National Historic District - which has been in use since 1908 - where you can watch weekly rodeos and a cowboy-approved lineup of events.

Pick up a pair of boots.

Saddle up at Stockyard Stables for a leisurely horseback ride along the Trinity River on the old Chisholm Trail. Choose a

30- or 60-minute ride, or take a spin around the arena.

Step 4:

Two-step the night away.

No trip to Fort Worth is complete without a little bit of line dancing. Give it a try at Billy Bob's Texas, the world's largest honky-tonk, or step on over to Pearl's Dancehall & Saloon, a former bordello owned by Buffalo Bill Cody that offers live country and Western swing.

A go-to recreation spot in Fort Worth, Trinity River has it all: dozens of cycling and running routes; boat, kayak, canoe and paddle boarding rentals; horseback riding and much more. Get your swimsuit, grab an inflatable boat or inner tube, and catch a live concert on Texas' only waterfront stage, at the Panther Island Pavilion, where events throughout the year draw music lovers and outdoorsy types. For even more adventures, head to Fort Worth Nature Center and Refuge.

Splash in the crisp waters of Burger's Lake, a 30-acre paradise with sandy beaches lined with large shade trees. Boat and fish on freshwater Eagle Mountain Lake, or head to Lake Worth for stand-up paddle boarding.

Hawaiian Falls - This waterpark features nearly a dozen rides.


